Contents of pressurised containers, including shaving foam and deodorants (up to 100 millilitres)



All other liquids, for example olive oil or cooking oil (up to 100 millilitres)



Zamzam water (up to 100 millilitres)



Liquids, pastes and gels - such as toothpaste, mascara, lip gloss and lip balm - as well as any similar items of comparable consistency at room temperature (up to 100 millilitres)



Creams, lotions, cosmetics, oils, perfumes, sprays and gels, including hair and shower gel (up to 100 millilitres)



Water, drinks, soups, syrups, jams, stews, sauces and pastes (Up to 100 millilitres)



Foods in sauces or containing a high liquid content (up to 100 millilitres)



LAGs: Liquids, aerosols and gels must be contained in one transparent re-sealable plastic bag of a capacity not exceeding 1 litre (or equivalent). The contents of the plastic bag should fit comfortably, and the bag should be completely closed.



Disabling and incapacitating chemicals, gases and sprays, such as mace, pepper or capsicum sprays, acid sprays, animal repellent sprays and tear gas

Spare batteries must be protected against the risk of short-circuiting by covering the terminals with insulating tape or placing them in the original manufacturer's packaging or a protective case, with each battery packed separately.

Power banks are considered spare batteries and must be properly secured to prevent short circuits or excessive heat that could cause explosion or ignition. Devices packed in checked baggage must be securely wrapped and completely switched off to prevent accidental activation.

Avalanche rescue backpack, one (1) per person, containing cartridges of compressed gas in Div. 2.2. <p>Batteries, spare/loose, including lithium batteries, non-spillable batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries and dry batteries for portable electronic devices must be carried in carry-on baggage only. Articles which have the primary purpose as a power source, e.g. power banks, are considered as spare batteries. These batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lithium metal batteries: the lithium metal content must not exceed 2 g. Lithium-ion batteries: the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh. Each person is limited to a maximum of 20 spare batteries. (The operator may approve the carriage of more than 20 batteries). Gas cartridges, small, non-flammable containing carbon dioxide or other suitable gas in Division 2.2. Up to two (2) small cartridges fitted into a self-inflating personal safety device, intended to be worn by a person such as a life jacket or vest. Not more than two (2) devices per passenger and up to two (2) spare small cartridges per device. Not more than four (4) cartridges up to 50 ml water capacity for other devices.	✗	✓	✓	✓

Hair styling equipment containing a hydrocarbon gas cartridge, up to one (1) per passenger or crew-member, provided that the safety cover is securely fitted over the heating element. Lithium batteries: Portable electronic devices (PED) containing lithium metal or lithium-ion cells or batteries, including medical devices such as portable oxygen concentrators (POC), and consumer electronics such as cameras, mobile phones, laptops and tablets. For lithium metal batteries, the lithium metal content must not exceed 2 g and for lithium-ion batteries the Watt-hour rating must not exceed 100 Wh. Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage. Each person is limited to a maximum of 15 PED. *The operator may approve the carriage of more than 15 PED.	✗	✓	✓	✗
Lithium battery-powered electronic devices. Lithium-ion batteries for portable (including medical) electronic devices (PED), a Wh rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh. For portable medical electronic devices (PMED) only, lithium metal batteries with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g. Devices in checked baggage must be completely switched off and must be protected from damage.	✗	✓	✓	✓
Lithium batteries, spare/loose with a Watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh for consumer electronic devices and PMED or with a lithium metal content exceeding 2 g but not exceeding 8 g for PMED only. Matches, safety (one small packet) or a small cigarette lighter that does not contain unabsorbed liquid fuel, other than liquefied gas, intended for use by an individual when carried on the person. The total net quantity of non-radioactive medicinal or toiletry articles and non-flammable, non-toxic (Division 2.2) aerosols in Division 2.2 must not exceed 2 kg or 2 L and the net quantity of each single article must not exceed 0.5 kg or 0.5 L.
